Participate! Take a tour of South Park and the Duwamish, get a closer look at the Living Barge, and check out local artists and businesses. All events are FREE, most are appropriate for all ages and will take place rain or shine.

Saturday, April 1: Opening Reception for the Living Barge Project

6 - 8 pm: Opening Reception at Gateway Park South, featuring a welcome from the Duwamish Tribe and sounds by local musician Mark Johnson.
8 pm: Opening Night Party at The County Line.

Saturday, April 8: South Park Walking Tours and Art Walk

Come explore all the historical, delicious, and unique things South Park has to offer! Take a guided or self-guided walking tour, check out local artists and local businesses and restaurants.
10:30 am – 3:30 pm: Guided walking tours will start hourly on the half-hour. Meet at the South Park Neighborhood Center.
6-9 PM: South Park's first art walk, featuring all South Park artists! Along the 14th Avenue business district in South Park.
8 PM: Music at the County Line: Amateur Radio Operator, Red Jacket Mine, and The Levitations. Doors at 8, music starts at 9.

4 - 6 pm: Inaugural Duwamish River boat tour (reservation only).

Sat. April 8

11 am, Gateway Park South: Join members from the Seattle Chapter of the American Society of Landscape Architects on a tour of the Living Barge with the artists.
1 pm. 2 pm. 3 pm: Tour the Duwamish with an expert! By water in a small motorboat. Guide: George Bloomberg, Port of Seattle, with an introduction by the artists. Limit 6 per tour.

11 am and 1 pm, Gateway Park North (8th Ave S and S Portland Street): Tour of the barge for kids of all ages, led by students at Aviation High School.

THE LIVING BARGE PROJECT * SCHEDULE OF EVENTS

Directions from Downtown Seattle:

South Park is located between the 1st Ave. S. Bridge and the 16th Ave. S. (South Park) Bridge, on the west bank of the Duwamish River.

To get to South Park, head south on SR 99 to the "South Park" exit that is just over the 1st Ave. S. Bridge. Turning towards Cloverdale St. (left off the exit ramp) will put you close to South Park's neighborhood business district; turning towards Holden St (right) will take you through the industrial areas in the north end of South Park, closer to the Living Barge.

Alternatively, veer left onto East Marginal Way just north of the 1st Ave S Bridge. Then take a right at 16th Ave. S. to cross the South Park Bridge. Going this way will put you right into "downtown" South Park, whereas trying to exit off 99 can be a little confusing.

The Best Land View of the Living Barge: [Gateway Park South](#), the small streetend park at the corner of 8th Ave. S. and S. Portland Street in South Park.

The Location of the Living Barge: Gateway Park North, at the end of 8th Ave. S. on the Georgetown side of the Duwamish (**please note that there is no actual access onto the barge**).

Seeing the Living Barge by water: A kayak, canoe, or small boat will get you closer to the Living Barge. It's also a great way to explore the Duwamish's industrial areas – and depending on the season you can see eagles, osprey, salmon, seals, and more. No access is permitted onto the barge. Paddle at your own risk. **Waterway Park**, a good place to put-in canoes or kayaks, is at the north end of 10th Ave. S. at Kenyon St - one block south and east of Gateway Park South.

The South Park Neighborhood Center, location for the [tile-making workshop](#), is at 8201 10th Ave. S.

The County Line, South Park's favorite dive bar, is located just south of the South Park (16th Ave S) Bridge at 8459 Dallas St.

The 14th Avenue South Business District is also just south of the South Park Bridge.

Cesar Chavez Park, where the plants from the Living Barge will be replanted, is just west of SR 99 on Cloverdale St.
